

INTERNATIONAL GUARD POLICY

1 Overview

- 1.1 This policy sets out the requirements that apply to International Guards that want to become members of Raglan Surf Life Saving Club.
- 1.2 The Constitution, Regulations and supplementary policies such as the Overnight Stay, Clubhouse and Clubhouse Access Policies that augment this policy.

2 Aims

- 2.1 To establish standard rules and protocols for international guards joining the club to be eligible for PLS
- 2.2 To maintain a high level of tidiness of the club house
- 2.3 To ensure International Guards know and meet club expectations well they are Members of Raglan Surf Life Saving Club.

3 General

3.1 Requirements

- (a) International Guards are required to be paid members of RSLSC before their membership is approved.
- (b) International Guards will be required to read, agree and sign the Clubhouse Access Policy, Overnight Stay Policy, Club House Policy and Code of Conduct.
- (c) International Guards agree to Patrol Voluntarily for at least one weekend day every week they stay at the clubhouse.
- (d) International Guards will be responsible for the tidiness of the kitchen, club room, bedrooms, gear shed and any equipment used during their stay.
- (e) Use of Equipment is via prior approval of the International Guard Co Ordinator or Gear Stewart. Any damages must be reported immediately.

3.2 **Accommodation**

- (a) RSLSC will provide accommodation from no earlier than Tuesday the 24th of October until the commencement of work for SLSNR PLS
- (b) During week days before the commencement of the PLS season International Guards are welcome to occupy their own rooms.
- (c) If a conflict between SLSNR paid staff and International Guards arises SLSNR staff will have priority for accommodation.
- (d) During weekends when voluntary guards are staying International Guards will be required to condense into a single bunk room from Friday night.
- (e) RSLSC will provide accommodation to a maximum of 6 International Guards at any one time.
